### Do you have any suggestions for what the instructor could have done differently to further support your learning?

#### Comments

Although I think that the publications covered in the course were very interesting and relevant, I feel that they were too central to the course structure. I think it would have helped for there to have been a clear theoretical background throughout the course and more material than just the research papers. I also think there could have been clearer lecture structures as sometimes discussions eclipsed the lecture itself.

No, Dr. Sharif was great, I don't have any critiques.

Dr. Sharif did a great deal to ensure everyone was understanding the material very well in giving useful examples and explaining key terms. Through her personal experience and research we've learned a lot about peacekeeping in Colombia. She always answered quickly via email and was available to talk prior and after class.

I would have preferred more lectures per week. Thought the class was absolutely amazing, albeit there was so much to cover!

I believe Dr. Sally has done everything beyond expectations in this course to deliver it in a productive way as possible. Dr. Sally supported my learning and offered help. she was there when I needed support and replied quickly to any concerns or questions regarding the course.

### Please identify what you consider to be the strengths of this course.

#### Comments

### Please provide suggestions on how this course might be improved.

#### Comments

Format wise, I think that having two quizzes every week was too much, especially given the little time between the sessions during the week (Wednesday–Friday) to prepare accordingly. I would suggest doing fewer quizzes or giving more time to answer the questions (e.g. during the weekend).

Nothing could be improved. Dr. Sharif deserves tenure. She is one of the most engaging, enthusiastic, and intelligent profs I have ever had. It is easy to tell that she is very dedicated to creating an atmosphere for academic rigour and takes pedagogy very seriously. I enjoy the fact that she uses the socratic method, whilst also being able to use every minute of lectures dissecting the course content. Not one boring moment in the class.

Maybe one thing I would suggest is to do more sections of group work on the readings and then answer them and one student represent the group each time It is a nice way for interaction and social skills and gives more chance for others who don't talk to participate and to come out of their comfort zone and be responsible for the group.

I think the presentation of the course (i.e., course description) could have been more specific – it was very research methods oriented, which I did not expect prior to starting the course.

#### Comments

I think Professor Sharif created a very engaging and open atmosphere, which I appreciate. I think students were made to feel like their contributions to the class were important and constructive. However, I think the lectures felt a little disorganized at times; I wonder if class discussions and explanations of research methods deviated from the lecture content.

Dr. Sharif was great, she was one of the most engaged and interesting professors I've ever had. She was respectful and created a class atmosphere where I felt encouraged to participate, ask questions, and make mistakes. She was great at explaining theory and giving examples in ways that the class could understand and remember. I've been able to apply a lot of what I've learned in this class to other courses and current events mainly because of the way Dr. Sharif taught.

Overall, the learning atmosphere in class was very fruitful and I believe everyone participated out of interest. The instructor was always very well prepared and made sure that everyone understands key concepts and ideas from the readings. Also, I liked that we were assigned more interactive materials such as videos, documentaries and newspaper articles.

My only suggestion for Dr. Sharif would be to not indicate other students' mistakes on quizzes or throughout the learning process in front of everyone, since I think the students may feel uncomfortable through this. Although it is meant well, it may not necessary resonate the same way on the other side.

## Comments

I think the only thing that could be improved was more consistency with the quizzes. They were effective as a way to grade whether readings had been completed, but because they were only meant to be done if you showed up to class they were effectively a participation grade as well. I understand that having them as part of attendance was the point, but because participation was worth 10% and the quizzes worth 30% it meant that even if you did the readings but couldn't make it to class your mark still suffered a significant amount. I think making in-class participation / attendance worth a bit more and making quizzes worth a bit less but separating the quizzes from the requirement to be in class and having the deadline consistently be EOD would be more fair for students without compromising the integrity of the course and the requirement to participate.

The format as well as contents of the course were really interesting and well structured and I learned a lot.

## Explanatory Note

### Percent Favourable Rating

This is the percentage of respondents who rated the instructor a 4 or 5 (Agree or Strongly Agree).

### Interpolated Median

The data collected for Student Experience of Instruction (SEI) are ordinal in nature, with a natural order (from 1 to 5). While the mean may be used as a measure of central tendency for such data, it is not an appropriate or accurate representation of SEI data (cf. Stark & Freishtat, 2014). The usual measure of central tendency for ordinal data is the median. As a result, we have been reporting the mean and the median for the last several years. After considerable thought and data modeling, we now believe that the interpolated median is the best representation of the data, since it takes the frequency distribution into account.

Consider the following example from 2015W, the two course sections have identical mean (3.8). However, the instructor in section 2 received 77% favourable (4-5) ratings, compared to 53% for the instructor in section 1. The Interpolated median values of (3.7 and 4.2), much better reflects the distribution of the scores above and below their respective median. Furthermore, the interpolated median is better correlated with percent favourable rating; such that an interpolated median of 3.5 on a Likert scale of 1 to 5, corresponds to 50% favourable rating.

## Dispersion Index

The dispersion index is a measure of variability suitable for ordinal data (Rampichini, Grilli & Petrucci 2004). This dispersion index has values between zero and 1. A zero dispersion index indicates that all respondents in the section rated their experience of instruction the same. An index value of 1.0 is obtained when the respondents are split evenly between the two extreme values (Strongly Disagree & Strongly Agree), a very rare occurrence. In SEI data at UBC, the index rarely exceeds 0.85, and mostly for evaluations not meeting the minimum recommended response rate.
